Lakshmi Ramgopal is a multidisciplinary artist who experiments with South Indian sound and movement traditions. Her live performances use improvisatory techniques to process vocals, synths, guitars, and the sruti box alongside Bharatanatyam dance choreography. Ramgopal released her debut EP *Migration* to praise from *Noisey, Chicago Reader*, Public Radio International's *The World*, and more. Her recent work includes *A Half-Light Chorus*, a sound installation in Chicago's Lincoln Park Conservatory for Experimental Sound Studio's *Florasonic* series, and a multidisciplinary ensemble performance for the 50th anniversary celebrations of Chicago's Museum of Contemporary Art. *Some Viscera*, her forthcoming EP, is due in late 2019. She is currently a postdoctoral fellow in the Department of the Classics at Harvard University and as of July 2019 will be Assistant Professor of History at Columbia University.
